I. COURSE DESCRIPTION

This two-semester Media course is offered for Upper-intermediate Level students to provide lessons on research and presentation skills with emphasis on improving knowledge of some cultures, heritage, greatest inventors.... all over the world. It includes further practice in speaking, reading, debating and study skills. In addition to knowledge improvement of students, the course puts emphasis on the importance of developing study skills, such as note-taking, critical thinking and writing, for students to be successful in higher proficiency classes and at college level in the future. In this course students learn English via the cultures of identified countries and improve the focused skill especially speaking and writing through the integrated activities and lessons.

Each skill area offers the following benefits to students by the course:

- **Searching:** Instructions on searching skills are provided to students to help them chose the best and the most suitable information for their topics so that they can apply for the skills on their future research endeavors. The focus will be on improving searching skills and strategies, and on strengthening vocabulary through activities.
- **Speaking, Debating and Presenting:** Instructions are designed to help students improve presentation skills, participating in discussions, as well as social conversations. Students will participate in discussions and debates, and give oral presentations using PP.
- **Writing:** The writing instruction will focus on both academic and non-academic paragraph writing. Students will analyze and practice paragraph and essay writing.
- **Grammar:** Students will practice challenging structures in English grammar to further their skills for accuracy and fluency to accomplish their intended academic goals in diverse educational contexts. This helps them have a better output writing essays.

II. COURSE GOALS

Course goals are designed to help students gain more knowledge about the cultures, custom and traditions of people all over the world so that they can develop their awareness on social issues. The course can also improve students' presentation which will make sense when they enroll in higher education in the future.

III. COURSE OBJECTIVES

Media curriculum is designed and implemented based on the spell out **AERO Curriculum Framework**, which makes the Curriculum Framework standards to be category-specific.

At the end of this course, students will gain knowledge about the world and can confidently present using PP with eloquence.

IV. COURSE REQUIREMENTS

A. Assessments

Students will take the course throughout the entire academic year. To measure student progress include presentations and writing at the end of each semester. The writing tasks will be added to the result of reading & writing test (20%).

B. Special Class Activities
